YOUNG ARTISTS IN HARMONY

For the past eight years, Art of Elan has offered its Young Artists in Harmony program in partnership with the nationally recognized A Reason To Survive (ARTS), an organization that believes in the power of the arts and creativity to literally transform lives – especially those of kids facing adversity. Consisting of weekly workshops where students have the opportunity to be mentored by Art of Elan musicians through unique apprenticeships, the residency culminates with a collaborative concert that showcases original compositions the students create over the 10-week residency, performed by Art of Elan musicians. Each concert is professionally recorded and is available for free streaming and download on Instant Encore. The 2020-21 season saw an expansion of this empowerment program to include advanced music students from The Preuss School, which serves first-generation college seekers.
